
Substance Use

Ate family meals at least three days per week




Saw substance-related content on their social media

Past Year Substance Use Prevalence

Alcohol remains the substance most widely used by 7th- and 8th- grade students in the past year, followed by e-cigarettes, then marijuana.





E-cigarettes

The most common **substance** was nicotine, then CBD or flavoring, then marijuana.

The most common **method** was smoking, then vaping, and eating.
